

WOOSTER CITY COUNCIL MINUTES
July 3, 2017

I. ROLL CALL & ORDERING OF AGENDA

President Mike Buytendyk called the regular meeting of Wooster City Council to order at 7:30 p.m. in council chambers. Acting Council Clerk, Andrei Dordea, called roll, present were Jon Ansel, Mark Cavin, Barb Knapic, Craig Sanders, Dave Silvestri, Scott Myers and Jon Ulbright. City Administration present: Mayor Bob Breneman, Officer Shane Berry.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

VII. NEW BUSINESS


