ORDINANCE NO. 2013-11

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 160, BIDDING PROCEDURES AND CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS, OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WOOSTER, OHIO, BY INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF THE LIMIT FOR COMPETITIVE BIDDING

WHEREAS, the Director of Administration has recommend that the City's bidding ordinance be amended to bring it into conformity with Ohio law regarding the threshold at which municipalities are required to competitively bid certain types of contracts.

NÓW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOOSTER, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 160, Bidding Procedures and Contract Requirements, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Wooster, Ohio, be amended at Section 160.03, BIDDING PROCEDURES, to read as follows:

160.03 BIDDING PROCEDURES.

- (a) The Director of Administration, or Administrator of the Wooster Community Hospital, or their designees, may make any contract, purchase supplies or material or provide labor for any work under the supervision of various departments and divisions and agencies of the City involving not more than twenty-five fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00).
- (b) When an expenditure within the department, division or agency, other than compensation of persons employed therein, exceeds fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00), but is less than or equal to twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00), such expenditure shall first be authorized and directed by ordinance or resolution of Council, or in the case of the Wooster Community Hospital, by resolution of the Board of Governors.
- (eb) When an expenditure within the department, division or agency, other than compensation of persons employed therein, exceeds twenty-five fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00), such expenditure shall first be authorized and directed by ordinance or resolution of Council, or in the case of the Wooster Community Hospital, by resolution of the Board of Governors. When so authorized or directed, the Director of Administration or Hospital Administrator or their designees, shall make a written contract in the name of the City with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement for not less than two, nor more than four consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the City.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2012-10 BY INCREASING THE TERMS OF THE COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREA COMMITMENT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, this City Council, in Ordinance No. 2012-10, authorized the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Brasfond USA for Community Reinvestment Area Tax Incentives, including a capital investment of up to \$700,000.00 for construction of a new facility; and

WHEREAS, the project has been so successful that the enterprise would like to expand the scope of the new construction, including an additional investment of \$750,000.00 and the creation of additional jobs, all within the term of the existing CRA agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOOSTER, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 2012-10 is hereby amended to read: That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement on behalf of the City of Wooster with Brasfond USA for CRA tax incentives. The terms of such agreement will include, but not be limited to, the following: (1) investment of up to \$1,450,000.00 for new construction; (2) abatement of real estate taxes of 50%; (2) for a maximum term not to exceed ten (10) years; (4) retention of eight (8) and creation of at least three (3) full-time jobs; and (4) such other terms as the Mayor, in his/her discretion, deems appropriate.

SECTION 2. This Council finds and declares that all formal actions concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance occurred in an open meeting of this Council or its committees, in compliance with law.

A RESOLUTION STATING TO THE WAYNE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, PURSUANT TO REVISED CODE SECTION 709.03, THE SERVICES WHICH THE CITY OF WOOSTER WOULD BE ABLE TO PROVIDE FOR TERRITORY LOCATED ON THE EAST SIDE OF MECHANICSBURG ROAD, NORTH OF ITS INTERSECTION WITH CROSSWIND COURT, AND CONTIGUOUS TO THE CORPORATION LIMITS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. (Matthew A. Long, Esq., Agent for Petitioners Habitat for Humanity in Wayne County, Inc.)

WHEREAS, Matthew A. Long, Esq., agent for Petitioners, has, pursuant to Revised Code Section 709.02, filed a petition with the Wayne County Commissioners seeking annexation of 0.526 acres of land owned by petitioners in Wayne Township, adjacent to the City of Wooster (a map of said area is attached hereto); and

WHEREAS, Revised Code Section 709.03 provides that upon the clerk of the municipal legislative authority receiving notice of a proposed annexation, the municipal legislative authority shall, by ordinance or resolution, adopt a statement indicating what services, if any, the municipal corporation will be able to provide upon annexation of the territory proposed for annexation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOOSTER, OHIO:

SECTION 1: That upon annexation to the City of Wooster, the land contained in the petition for annexation would receive the following services from the City of Wooster:

- A. Police protection from the full-time police department of the City of Wooster; and fire protection and emergency squad services from the full-time fire department of the City of Wooster. The projected response time for fire and emergency squad is ____ minutes from Station 2, first-in unit; and ____ minutes from Station 1, second-in unit. These services would be immediately available.
- B. A six-inch water line is located on Crosswind Court, adjacent to the territory proposed for annexation, and immediately accessible for extension thereto. The water plant and water resources of the City of Wooster have sufficient capacity to serve this property. This service would be immediately available upon the Petitioners paying the necessary fees and obtaining the necessary permits.
- C. A twelve-inch sanitary sewer line is located on Mechanicsburg Road, adjacent to the territory proposed for annexation, and immediately accessible for extension thereto. The water pollution control plant has sufficient capacity to serve this property. This service would be immediately available upon the Petitioners paying the necessary fees and obtaining the necessary permits.

D. The City would also provide miscellaneous other city services, including, but not limited to, residential solid waste pickup, maintenance of dedicated streets and access to parks and recreation facilities. These services would be immediately available.

SECTION 2. This Council finds and declares that all formal actions concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution occurred in an open meeting of this Council or its committees, in compliance with law.

SECTION 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary to the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, safety and welfare of the City or providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department or division, and for the further reason that it is necessary to act pursuant to statute to provide timely notice to the Wayne County Commissioners of services which the City would provide in order to facilitate the orderly process of annexation; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its passage and approval by the Mayor; provided it receives the affirmative vote of at least three-fourths of the members of the Council; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

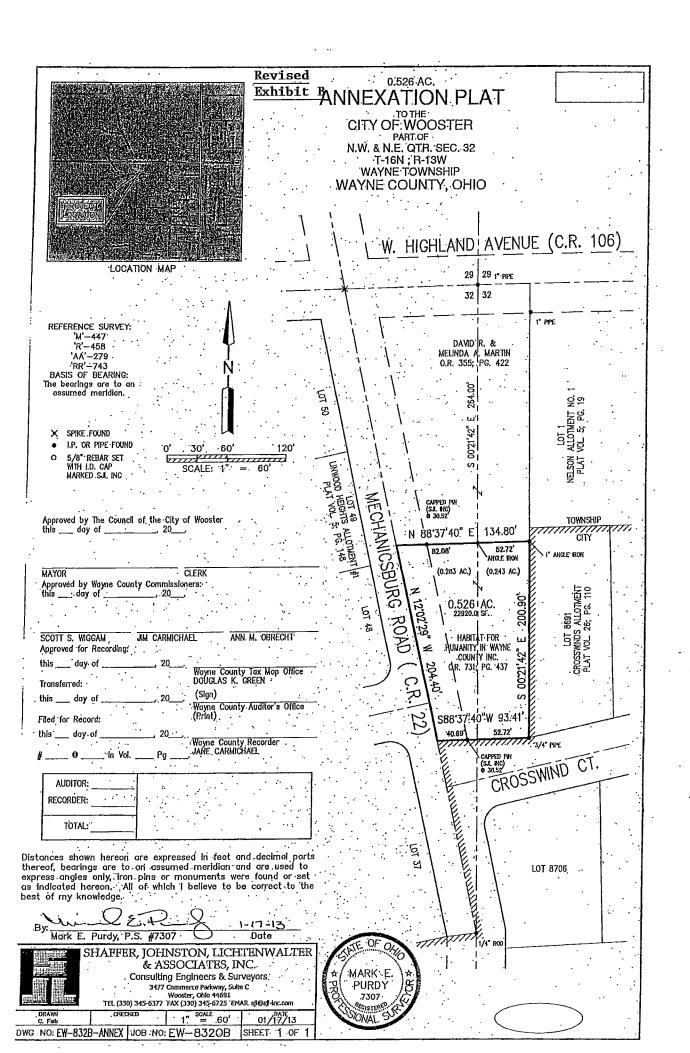

The City agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the entire cost of the improvement, less the amount of Federal-aid and State funds set aside by the Director of Transportation for the financing of this improvement from funds allocated by the Federal Highway Administration, U.S. Department of Transportation.

The share of the cost of the LPA is now estimated in the amount of **One Hundred Eleven Thousand Five Hundred Forty One and - - - 00/100 Dollars, (\$111,541.00),** but said estimated amount is to be adjusted in order that the LPA's ultimate share of said improvement shall correspond with said percentages of actual costs when said actual costs are determined; and

WHEREAS, The Director of Transportation has approved said legislation proposing cooperation and has caused to be made plans and specifications and an estimate of cost and expense for improving the above described highway and has transmitted copies of the same to this legislative authority; and

WHEREAS, The LPA desires the Director of Transportation to proceed with the aforesaid highway improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved:

I. That the estimated sum, of One Hundred Eleven Thousand Five Hundred Forty One and - - - - 00/100 Dollars (\$111,541.00) is hereby appropriated for the improvement described above and the fiscal officer is hereby authorized and directed to issue an order on the treasurer for said sum upon the requisition of the Director of Transportation to pay the cost and expense of said improvement. We hereby agree to assume in the first instance, the share of the cost and expense over and above the amount to be paid from Federal funds.

- II. That the LPA hereby requests the Director of Transportation to proceed with the aforesaid highway improvement.
- III. That the LPA enter into a contract with the State, and that **Mayor** be, and is hereby authorized to execute said contract, providing for the payment of the LPA the sum of money set forth herein above for improving the described project.
- IV. That the LPA transmit to the Director of Transportation a fully executed copy of this Resolution.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ACCEPT AND APPLY GRANT MONIES FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Fire Division received a grant from the Department of Homeland Security, Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program, to fund programs for the safety of firefighters and the general public; and

WHEREAS, the project has been approved at \$119,000.00, of which amount the DHS will contribute 90%, or \$107,100.00, subject to a ten percent (10%) local match in the amount of \$11,900.00, with such funds to be expended for the acquisition of equipment related to rescue and emergency medical care; and it is necessary to formally accept the funds and execute certain documents in connection therewith.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOOSTER, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to accept grant monies awarded by the Department of Homeland Security, Office of Domestic Preparedness; to expend such monies, plus a ten percent (10%) local match, in accordance with the terms of such grant; and to execute any necessary documents in connection therewith. In conjunction with this authority, the amount of \$119,000.00 is hereby appropriated for the purposes stated herein.

SECTION 2. This Council finds and declares that all formal actions concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution occurred in an open meeting of this Council or its committees, in compliance with law.

SECTION 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary to the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, safety and welfare of the City, or providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department or division, and for the further reason that prompt acceptance is necessary in order to utilize the grant monies for the health and wellness of the fire division personnel; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its passage and approval by the Mayor; provided it receives the affirmative vote of at least three-fourths of the members of the Council; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
