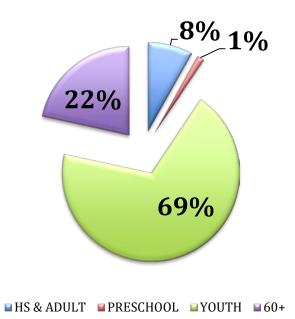
Economic Impact

Wooster Transportation Program Transports and Participants

The City of Wooster Transportation Program was established to assist low income residents with transportation within the city. Beginning in June 2016, the City entered a partnership with Community Action Wayne/Medina to increase and improve transportation provided to all Wooster residents.

Qualified participants purchase taxi passes for \$4 per transport and bus passes for \$1 per transport at the Community Center and City Hall (FIRST HALF OF 2016) and at Community Action Wayne/Medina (SECOND HALF of 2016).
