March 18, 2019

I. ROLL CALL & ORDERING OF AGENDA

President Mike Buytendyk called the regular meeting of Wooster City Council to order at 7:30 p.m. in council chambers. John Scavelli, Acting Council Clerk, called roll with the following members present; Scott Myers, Craig Sanders, Dave Silvestri, Jon Ansel, Bill Bostancic, Jennifer Warden and Mark Cavin. AN ORDINANCE VACATING AN UNNAMED ALLEY RUNNING IN A
NORTHEAST DIRECTION IN THE CITY OF WOOSTER (FROM BEALL AVENUE
TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF LOT 665 AND THE NORTHEAST CORNER
OF LOT 652) (Bostancic)

Councilman Bostancic stated 100% of the adjacent property owners had signed the petition and the City's fire, police and engineering departments had reviewed the application for any conflicts or problems. The City has found there to be good cause for vacating the alley.

FROM THE CITY OF WOOSTER TO THE OHIO-ERIE TRAIL, AND
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Councilman Myers said this is basically funds to provide signage for the route to make it a designated route. There is a lot of community effort and support for this. There is a trail fund established with the Greater Wayne County Foundation to handle other types of maintenance. Councilman Myers read a letter of support from Chuck Malta.

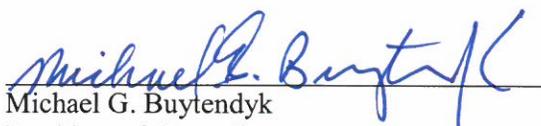
