# **Major Accomplishments**

- Bike Committee A Bike Trail fundraiser was held in May of 2019. Participants rode from Wooster to Fredericksburg and back to Wooster. Over \$8,500 was raised from this event. The goal of this celebration was to bring community awareness to the City of Wooster and the Wayne County Bike Trail System.
- Freedlander Chalet Since being closed to the public in 2010, the Freedlander Chalet was
  recently renovated and construction (performed by the City's Public Properties
  Maintenance Division) was completed in May 2019. A public open house was held after
  construction was completed and the first rental took place in June 2019. Ongoing
  renovations and additions are scheduled for Spring 2020.
- Transportation The City of Wooster's partnership with Community Action
  Wayne/Medina has significantly improved the transportation options for Wooster citizens
  and visitors. We currently have seven local providers offering subsidized transportation
  services to our community. In 2019, a second route was added to the Wooster Transit
  schedule, which expanded services to medical, work related and residential locations,
  thus improving the quality of life for our citizens.

# **Major Projects Completed**

- The City of Wooster purchased properties west of the Community Center in anticipation
  of future development at the Wooster Community Center. One property was razed with
  more to follow in 2020.
- Work was completed on the pool structure at Christmas Run Pool. All leaks in the pool liner were repaired. More work will take place in the fall of 2020.
- Purchased and installed two pergolas at Freedlander Pool.

### Goals Achieved in 2019

- Online registrations account for 20% of our total transactions.
- Provided more options for Drop-In registration which has proved successful for adding new class members.
- Wooster Recreation Facebook page likes totaled 2166. That's up from 1820 (2018), 1273 (2017) and 807 (2016).



- Utilized electronic sign for program marketing and city wide announcements.
- Provided Youth Sports and Activities Guide contact page on our website for parents looking for contact information for sports organizations in and around Wooster.
- Transportation contract with Community Action of Wayne/Medina Counties.
- AARP provides free tax aide for local citizens regardless of age or income level.
- Wayne County Humane Society holds "Paws in the Park Pawty" at Freedlander Park to promote pet safety and awareness.
- Wooster Healthy Living partnership with community agencies and businesses to promote health and wellness opportunities in our community.
- Partner with Wooster YMCA to staff our aquatic facilities and make the Natatorium available for City of Wooster pool pass holders during the Summer months. City pass holders may now use the Natatorium from Memorial weekend through December 31<sup>st</sup>.
- Contract with Wooster Soccer Association, Wooster Summer Baseball and Wooster Girls Fastpitch, just to name a few, to provide recreational opportunities for our community youth.

# **Economic Impact**

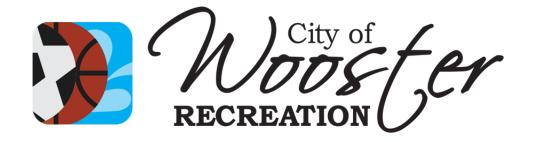

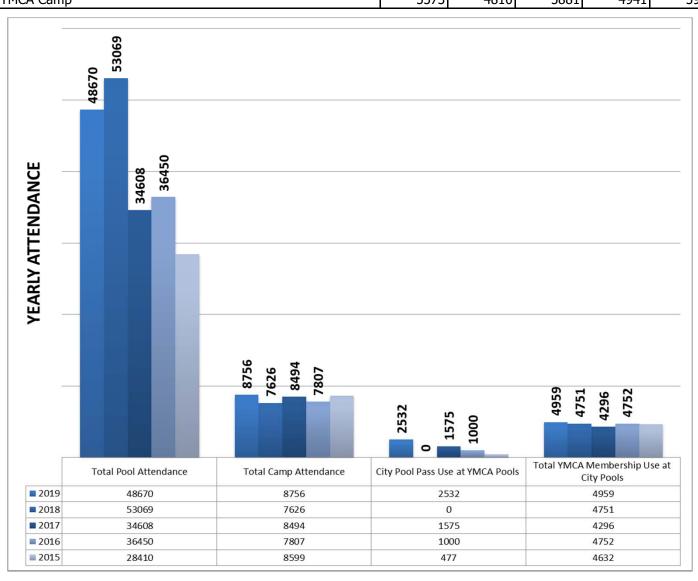

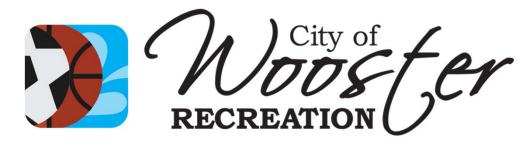
