Facade Program

Nowntown Beautification Continues for Local Businesses

The City of Wooster in partnership with Main Street Wooster granted \$50,000.00 to business and building owners in Downtown Wooster for facade improvements. The purpose of the program is to create an incentive for owners to improve their property and enhance the appearance of Downtown Wooster. This will assist in keeping Downtown Wooster as a destination location, stabilize property values and attract private investment. The money was granted to Main Street Wooster from funds received through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). These are federal funds allocated in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Main Street Wooster allocated the grants to eligible applicants and was capped at 30% of eligible costs to a maximum of \$5,000.00. There were 17 applications received with 14 determined to be eligible. Of the 14 eligible projects, 11 were granted funds. The eligible projects have a total estimated improvement value of \$666,730.00. The larger projects will most likely have phased construction, as funds become available.




Construction

Roadway Improvements are in Progress

Dirt Dawg Excavating was awarded the Melrose Drive Reconstruction project at an estimated cost of over \$3.9 Million. Preliminary work has begun with a final completion date scheduled for November 30, 2023.

This project entails the construction of pavement, curb and gutter, sidewalks, drive approaches, a multi-use path, sanitary sewers and storm sewers from Milltown Road north to Smithville Western Road.



Potholes continue to decrease due to our road resurfacing investments.



This will be the final phase of improving Melrose Drive and providing one more section for our multi-use bike path plan.

Other major projects include:

- Resurfacing sections of Beall Avenue, Cleveland Road and S. Columbus Ave.
- Concrete replacement on various streets
- West Milltown right turn lanes
- Downtown Traffic Signals
- Waterline replacements
- Water Tank Painting

State Route 83 Major Rehabilitation

Project ID: 91095

Begin construction: Winter 2021/2022

End construction: Fall 2023

The project extends from the U.S. 30/SR 83 interchange ramps to just north of Friendsville Road, located in the city of Wooster. The current pavement has reached the end of its useful life and needs to be replaced.

The project includes pavement replacement along SR 83 and along SR 3 (Cleveland Road), from SR 83 to Milltown Road. The removal of the deteriorated concrete pavement along SR 83 will be replaced with asphalt pavement, and the concrete pavement along the ramps will be replaced. In addition to the resurfacing work, the project also includes:

- Drainage repairs
- Updated pavement markings, raised pavement markers, and guardrail
- · Bridge rehabilitation work
- Culvert repairs
- Installing vandal protection fence on the SR 585 bridge over SR 83

As part of the reconstruction work, the shoulders on the SR 585 interchange loop ramps will be widened and merge areas will be increased on the entrance ramps from U.S. 30 westbound, and the SR 585 ramp to SR 83 northbound. The SR 3 northbound ramp to Cleveland Road will also be changed from a two-lane exit to a one-lane exit. Additionally, sight distance on SR 83 northbound, south of the SR 3 interchange, will be improved.

This project was awarded to Kokosing Construction Company Inc. for approximately \$30 million and has an expected completion date of October 2023.
