
Recreation Department

Did you know we have two different Farmer's Markets?


Saturday mornings beginning on May 13th, you can find the Main Street Wooster Farmer's Market hosted on the downtown square.

Things you should know!

Before taking the online survey,

consider the following statements as you think about the future of your community!

Housing & Population



- » As household structure continues to evolve, what housing types will be needed in Wooster?
 - 76% of Wooster households are WITHOUT children
 - 43% of Wooster adults are married
 - 40% of housing units are renter occupied
- » The housing in Wooster is aging (median year-built age is 1974). If new housing is built, what kind should it be?
 - 66% of housing units are single-family homes

Growth & New Development



- » Wooster has grown by approx. 100+ people each year since 2000. If this trend continues, what do you think the city could look like in the future?
- » There is limited residentially developable land in Wooster (less than 1% remains for marketable infill). Should new development be focused inside city limits? Or built on land which could be annexed into the city?
 - Approx. 100 acres remain developable for higher-density development (i.e. single family homes on small lots, duplexes, townhomes, apartments, etc.)

Parks & Recreation



- » Wooster has over 700 acres of park land, which greatly exceeds the national median of acres per 1000 residents. How should we improve those spaces in the future?
 - Wooster has 25.9 acres per 1000 residents, while the national median is 10.6.
- » The existing Community Center is aging (built in 1976) and may be in need of an updated vision. Should this center be replaced/ renovated and what does the future programming look like?

Connectivity & Mobility



- » As portions of the city continue to grow and develop, are there missing connections today that should be explored?
 - There are currently 7 miles of existing protected bike trails and 2 miles of painted bike lanes in Wooster.
 - There is currently 1 mile of trail being constructed, with 1.3 miles being designed.

Officer Hall acts as the force's Community Relations Officer.


Fire

Built in 1962, the Fire Station on Market Street is due for an upgrade.

The Design Phase is complete and construction is slated to start Summer 2023.

Personnel and equipment will be temporarily housed on Mechanicsburg Road.

Major Construction Projects

Phase 2 of the Dix Expressway project, managed by ODOT, includes closing the ramps at Akron Road beginning April 12th.

This will create difficulties for area businesses and residents but is necessary for the infrastructure improvements needed. The project is slated to be completed April 2024.

Melrose Drive Reconstruction continues to be closed to thru traffic. The contractor has been working throughout the winter on utility improvements. The roadway improvements will be started as the weather warms.

This project is scheduled for completion November 2023.

The Engineering Division will once again be managing many different projects this year. These are just a few of the projects beginning this spring.

- Waterlines: Giffen Road, Palmer Street Bridge, Sherwood Hills Allotment
- Sanitary Sewer: North End Sanitary Sewer Project,
 W. Milltown Road Sanitary Sewer, Melrose Lift Station
- Concrete Pavement Repairs: Arthur Drive, Ruth Circle, Reta Circle & E. Wayne Avenue
- Paving/Resurfacing: E. Henry Street, E. South Street, W. Larwill Street, N. Geyers Chapel Road, Back Orrville Road, Smithville-Western Road, Winter Street

Planning for the Future

City Council recently approved over \$11M in debt service to fund upgrades to the City's wastewater plant.

The improvements include Headworks Improvements, Digester Upgrades and Feedstock Receiving.

Maintaining and upgrading this City asset ensures our citizens and business continue to receive this necessary service, now and in the future.

Bike to Work Week

National Bike to Work Week is May 15th - May 21st. On May 19th, we encourage you to Ride Your Bike to Work. With over 11 miles of finished multi-use trails and bike lanes, Wooster is striving to be a bike friendly community.

By the end of 2023, the multi-use trail along Melrose Drive up to Smithville-Western will be completed, adding another leg onto our trail system.




IN 2024, A MULTI-USE

All officials assigned to work games and matches for our Wooster Recreation youth and adult leagues are compensated for their time. The pay rate varies depending on the level of experience an official has and if they are certified in that specific sport. Anyone interested in becoming an official should contact the Wooster Recreation Department. We hire non-certified people who know the game to officiate younger division games in our basketball and soccer leagues and are able to guide interested individuals on how to become certified in specific sports.
