- Low to Moderate Income Residents (See Chart) who:
  - Want to repair the homes they live in.
  - Need assistance purchasing a home.
  - Need assistance to lower the cost of rent.
- Landlords needing to repair old apartments and able to commit to rent control for a period of time.

#### 2023 TARGET CHIP Activities:


- Our Wooster-Wayne-Orrville CHIP Partnership Team reached out to multiple social service providers, governments, and local agencies to determine how to best balance limited funding opportunities with local needs.
- \* Target Projects for Application (available countywide):
  - ❖ Private Owner Rehabilitation: 9 Projects (~\$51K/unit)
    - \* No similar programs available, steady demand.
  - Private Rental Rehabilitation: 2 Projects (~\$55K/unit)
     No similar programs available, significant demand.
  - Homeownership Assistance: 1 Project (~\$60K/unit)
    No similar program available, steady demand.
  - Emergency Home Repair Grants: 23 Projects (~\$12K/unit)
     No similar program available, steady demand.
  - \* Expanded Fair Housing support.

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#### **Additional CHIP Activities:**

- \* Potential CHIP Activities not being pursued for this PY2023 grant cycle after analysis:
  - Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (income-dependent)
    - \* Ohio and HUD policies place recipients at substantial risk of sudden homelessness.
    - \* Similar programs available, lack of participating landlords in the local market prevents these funds from being utilized.
  - Rental Home Repair (~\$18K/unit)
    - \* Other enforcement mechanisms exist to ensure landlords maintain property safety.
    - \* Significant level of financial expenditure without an LMI commitment to remedy property maintenance issues resulting from poor property management or planning by a recipient landlord.
  - ❖ New Construction Habitat for Humanity (~\$30K/unit)
    - \* Local capacity is limited to support projects on Ohio/HUD schedules.



#### 2023 TARGET CHIP Activities:

- \* Timetable for ALL PROJECTS:
  - \* Taking Applications Now
  - Projects could start 1/1/2024.
  - **\*** Funding available to as long as long as funds last.
    - \*Note, for Private Owner and Private Rental Rehabilitation Projects, when more than one application is provided during a single quarter, projects will ranked for funding in order of distress.
- \* National Objective for All Projects (or *Purpose* of Funds)
  - \* Firstly: Benefit to Low-and-Moderate Income Persons
    - \* Secondary: Prevention and Elimination of Slum and Blight

- \* Funding supports 35 projects to preserve housing.
- \* WMHA's expert staff will help those interested through every step in the process: From reviewing programs to filling out applications to inspecting contractor's work and resolving any issues.

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### **CHIP Projects:**

### Types of Activities - Continued

- Apply for a CHIP Grant:
  - 1. Homeowners must be defined as low-to-moderate income (\$46,400 for one person, or \$66,250 for a family of four.)
  - 2. Must select a contractor from list of approved contractors.
  - 3. Generally must own home for 2 to 5 years before loan is be forgiven (5 to 15 for landlords and Down-Payment assistance).
  - 4. Note: Wooster and Wayne County **do not** subordinate mortgages when an owner is refinancing to take cash out.
  - 5. Applications are accepted every month until funds run out. Priority for *rehabilitation projects* are given to homes with the greatest need. Rental projects are scored based on need, with some projects requiring a larger landlord match.

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
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### Partnership CHIP Service Area

- If **funded**, CHIP would allow for housing repair grants throughout Wayne County.
- Wooster, Orrville,
   Rittman, and Wayne
   County are individual
   jurisdictions, based on
   population.
- Working together allows for additional funding while pooling other resources.



### 2023-2025 Partnership Application



- Wayne County (which also covers Orrville and Rittman) and Wooster each have a **Project Review Committee** that **reviews** and **selects** projects for CHIP. Wayne Metropolitan Housing Authority, as a third-party non-profit consultant, will administer the grant.
- Historically, since CHIP is a **highly competitive program** for communities to secure. The Partnership **has not** requested the maximum amount of funds to increase its chance of securing funding.

- **IMPORTANT:** For **ANY** major rehabilitation or new construction project, Rittman, Wooster, Orrville, Shreve, Dalton, and Doylestown have free and simple <u>tax abatements</u> for homes in certain neighborhoods.
- *Up to* 100% 15 Year property-tax savings on increased value.
